

GRANDFATHER ABLE TO REUNITE WITH GRANDDAUGHTER AS ALLEGATIONS OF CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE DISMISSED

A grandfather who maintained a loving relationship with his granddaughter was suddenly stripped of his rights to see the child after sexual abuse allegations were made by the child's mother who was jealous of the relationship between the child and the grandfather. Stanziano & Catron, PSC was able to try the case to a special judge of the Barren County Family Court and to a verdict in favor of the grandfather.

“This case shows just how upside down someone's life can get when incompetent social services personnel team up with biased police to try to validate absurd claims by a parent who is bent on destruction at any cost, “ said Bethany Catron, the grandfather's lead counsel. “The child was interviewed and said nothing had happened. The medical evidence proved nothing happened. And, yet, the social workers insisted that the child be placed in counseling. I think they hoped she could be talked into making allegations against this loving and caring grandparent. Fortunately, the child remained steadfast.”

The child, who was kept from seeing her grandfather for nearly two years, leaped into her grandfather's arms on their first visit following the trial court's verdict.
